A. Course proposals

- SBS Subcommittee recommended approval of the resubmitted ECON 105 in SBS; full committee unanimously approved, commending the responsiveness of the submitter to the committee's concerns.

III. New Business

A. E-mail voting

 In light of the growing practice of subcommittee and full committee discussions and, occasionally, voting over email, Don Boileau volunteered to make some recommendations for protocol for the committee's consideration.

B. IT 103 learning outcomes / IT Ethics

Continued discussion of the history and purpose of the IT ethics requirement
and its creation of a variety of one-credit courses and course sequences,
which seem administratively unwieldy to some and possibly confusing to
students and advisers. Committee consensus: IT ethics is a sufficiently
important and cross-disciplinary issue that it should be reflected in learning
outcomes for the IT category. More thought should be given to the role of
ethics in other disciplines (or across the curriculum); Mary Zamon and other
committee members will gather information on the current mapping of ethics
modules in a variety of units. Further discussion of IT learning outcomes to
follow.
