		was concerned by the LO inconsistencies between the
		attached syllabus and the proposal. Additionally, there was
		still a concern for how LOs 1 and 2 are being met. For
		example, the assignment map is missing a clear idea of how
		analysis is being assessed for LO2. More clarity needed to
		support how those aspects will be evaluated (a written
		response/statement as part of the assignment, for example).

		still a concern for how some of the LOs are being met.

		Overall the Committee was excited about this addition to
		Mason Apex. There was an administrative suggestion to
		adjust the required credits (catalog entry lists 60 as a prerec,
		but Apex requires at least 85). Suggestion to add clarifying
		details to anchor the assignments better to Apex outcomes
		(and including those on the syllabus).

		This course was met with enthusiasm as an Arts course.
		Some concerns about the sustainability plan, which led to a
		discussion by the committee members on the validity of this
		section (not related to the course's approval).
	ENGH 374: Screening the

		The Committee was initially concerned that this course
		seemed like a less natural fit for Global Context as it did for
		the Arts distinction. Discussion ensued.

		The Committee was split on the reception of this course.
		Some felt it was a natural fit within the IT category, while
		others felt the course did not coordinate with the LOs well.
Information		One critique made related to the idea that the assignments
Technology &		did not sufficiently meet the LOs as written. For example,
Computing	ENGH 210: Equitable AI	students might be using IT to organize information, but there

isn't clear evidence they are analyzing the IT processes (LO3). Discussion ensued.
