Just Societies	SOCW 200: Introduction to Social Work	New	The committee was impressed by the proposal, particularly in how the two-layer assessment/ reflection process in learning outcome (LO) 1b was developed. However, the syllabus was missing the learning outcomes for SBS, which is the original Exploration category this course is approved for.
			Vote: Approved, pending administrative review of the syllabus

SBS	<u>RMGT 210: Recreation and</u> <u>Leisure in Life</u>	Resubmission	The committee appreciated the revisions to this course but noted concerns with LOs 2 and 3, indicating that while LO 1 included requested language, it lacked depth and connection to the assignment. There was also a need for the course to better support how the LOs are foundational to the course's overall context. Vote: Rollback
Just Societies	<u>RMGT 210: Recreation and</u> <u>Leisure in Life</u>	Resubmission	Overall the committee was impressed by the revisions and approved the JS flag, pending the approval of SBS. Vote: approved, pending SBS approval
Mason Apex	ELED 480: Practicum in Elementary Education	New	The committee is supportive of this course but would like more clarity on what assignments will be submitted for assessment purposes. Additionally, the course management plan needs to be strengthened. Vote: Rollback
IT&C	<u>COMM 320: Business and</u> Professional Communication	Resubmission	The committee appreciates the revisions but would like to see a stronger inclusion of privacy within the assignment for LO1 to ensure the learning outcome is fully met. Vote: Rollback
Writing Intensive	ELED 305: Foundations of Elementary Methods and Management	New	The committee is supportive of this course but would like to see more clarity provided on how revision will be incorporated into the writing process. A professional development plan is also needed. Vote: Rollback
Natural Science Overview	GOVT 352: Responsible Innovation	New	The committee appreciates the effort spent developing this course but does not see this course meeting the Natural Science

			category expectations on a fundamental level, even with substantial revisions, as the course content seems disconnected from the category's main focus of natural science, as opposed to technology. Suggestion to consider another Exploration category it might fit to more naturally.
Just Societies	<u>GOVT 352: Responsible</u> <u>Innovation</u>	New	The course seems to be a more natural fit for Just Societies, but the assignments for LOs 1a and 1b need to more clearly connect to defining and then using key terms related to justice, equity, diversity, and inclusion.
Global Contexts	<u>GOVT 132: Introduction to</u> <u>International Politics</u>	Resubmission	The committee appreciates the revisions made to this course, but would like to see a tighter approach to LO3. As it currently it written, there are optional questions included in the assignment map, which complicates the assessable nature of those assignments. Suggestion to narrow the focus to the required components and remove the optional questions.
